2701 PPCLI Cadets

Annual Ceremonial Review - The unit held their annual ceremonial review on May 28, 2016. The families of most cadets were present for what was the final formal parade of the year. A number of awards were presented to deserving cadets.

Each year the Legion presents the cadet medal of excellence to a deserving cadet. The award is presented at the annual ceremonial review. The winner this year was Cadet Master Warrant Officer Nathan Castagner. He has completed the leadership and challenge courses, expedition training, expedition instructor and expedition challenge training. He has been selected to attend the basic parachutist course in Trenton this summer. His longer term objective is to attend Royal

Military College in Kingston.

Some of you might recall that his sister, Nathalie, won the award last year.

Unfortunately for 2701 PPCLI cadets, Nathan and his family will be moving to Ottawa later this summer. A unit in our national capital will benefit from his four years training in Winnipeg.

Unit Strength - The number of cadets in the unit declined slightly over the past year. An aggressive recruiting campaign will begin in August to recover their traditional levels. They will contract to have two mobile recruiting signs in the area beginning in late August 2016. They will also participate in the MFRC fall fair, which has been an effective recruiting source for youth whose parents are in the military. Several recruiting posters have been developed and will be placed on school and community notice boards. Drum Line - One of their most effective recruiting activities is the drum line. It is led by Captain Rick Sellwood, who has been with the unit for a number of years. He is a very proficient musician and uses those attributes to develop aspiring drummers. The drum line is invited to perform at several venues throughout the year. Those performances contribute to youth development, help promote the unit and encourage others to consider 2701 PPCLI Cadets.

Summer Training – In addition to the basic parachutist course that Nathan Castagner will attend, fourteen cadets will participate in courses such as general military training in Vernon, BC, basic fitness and sports in Cold Lake AB, and advanced band in Rocky Mountain.

Adult Leaders - They are fortunate in having some very good adult leaders. One of their officers, Lieutenant Dominic Dasyuva, will be leaving in the next few months to enrol in the Militia. He has spent about fifteen years with the unit including his time as a cadet and adult leader. He has been a good role model. It will be a challenge to find a suitable replacement. They have started the recruiting process, but it will be several months before the results are finalized.
